We had a late apology from Frankston Mayor Nathan Conroy – on the plus side, the speech to open the Art Show fell to me, so a declaration that the Art Show was open was stated in much less time than if Nathan was there.

The standard of the artworks were pretty impressive too – Anita and I bought a painting we particularly liked. FHS students also had an artwork display and provided the musical entertainment for the evening.

Quite a few of the artists were also in attendance – a highlight was being able to introduce artist Billy Nye and Serena Sanderson (Sirene Pearls) to those attending. They spoke about Billy's "King of the Hill" painting and Serena's beautiful AAA Grade pearl earrings, which they had donated to us to auction off. Thank you, Serena and Billy, for your very generous donations, which raised a significant \$2,600.

The evening was so successful due to the efforts of so many – the people operating the bar, those selling raffle tickets and taking sales orders out the front, our sales reps on the floor, MC Bill Redfern, auctioneer Terry Schneider; all coordinated by Max, Lee Anne and Lyn. Well done to all concerned.

WhatsApp Etiquette

A reminder on what is acceptable when using our *RCF WhatsApp* account: Hours of use is <u>between 9am and 9pm</u> – please do not send messages outside these hours.
