90 Canadian Bay Rd, Mt Eliza Phone (03) 9787 3047 program was started by the RC of Melbourne and now is Australia-wide, aiming to eliminate the leading cause of blindness in the world, in Australian communities.

Trachoma is caused by the in-turning of eyelashes, which then irritate the eye by scratching the cornea. Left untreated, this leads to blindness and can start at a very young age. In advanced cases, the treatment is by surgery, which involves tucking the eyelid such that the lashes grow outwards again.

Rotary's *End Trachoma* program focusses on prevention rather than surgical treatment. Sandi told us how remote communities throughout Australia is where this infectious disease is most prevalent. Great inroads have been made in recent years – in 2009, this disease affected 14% of 5- to 9-year-olds across Australia. By 2022, this had fallen to 2.2%. The Northern Territory was the most afflicted region, with a high of 20% but has now been reduced to 2.5%.

Across Australia, there are more than 250 Rotary clubs working towards the eradication of this disease. Sally is a former member of the Rotary Club of Warragul, where she was well known for promoting this program across our district, and now continues across District 9800. She spoke of her visits to remote communities throughout Australia, distributing materials that help to improve personal health through cleanliness in these areas where water quantity and quantity may be a problem.

The areas of focus for the *End Trachoma* program has been the distribution of toiletry and hygiene bags, mirrors (for facial cleanliness), donations of mobile clothes washer and dryer trailers in WA, and towels and linen. They also have several water trailers that are loaned to remote communities in times of need, such as large gatherings like funerals, where the local community's population swells. Sally told us a current focus is the distribution of footwear to young children in these remote regions.

Last weeks' board meeting

A brief summary of our board meeting last week:

- The Art Show raised \$26,000, with the board agreeing that we'll now donate \$20,000 to the Frankston SES. A small sum will be retained as seed funding for next year.
- On 30th May the Major Projects Director PP Terry Schneider and PE Bill Redfern will lead a discussion on fundraising opportunities for your club. This will include existing events, the Art Show and the Golf Day, and follow up on an idea by PP Neil Black for a Car Show.

- Our website has had a refresh, to update our group photo and remove old data re meetings and issues of the Tide, to new issues and meeting information.
- The replacement of our Rotary shirts is still on track, shortly members will be canvassed on final colours and designs.
- There has been no progress on the Rotary shed situation. As reported to the club recently, several of us met with FCC officers on-site. FCC have confirmed that they are now in the process of finalising their master plan. As soon as this is available, we'll then know whether our shed is to be impacted or not.
- It was agreed that we'd waive the requirement to return our BBQ trailer with a full gas bottle for the RCs of Frankston Sunrise and Peninsula 2.0. These clubs are using our trailer for the gunfire breakfast following the ANZAC Day Dawn Service. The gas will be our contribution to this community event.
- We look forward to inducting Sue Whithead, John Crowder and Upali De Sliva into the club in the coming weeks.
