BOARD REPORT: 20 SEPTEMBER:

Zoom Meeting Costs:

I received an email from a member about the Zoom cost of \$5 that the Board had imposed on members pointing out that under the Constitution the Board could not impose this cost.

Under Constitution Article 29 Funds, Section 1 – Source

(a) The funds of the club are to be derived from entrance fees and annual subscriptions of members, donations and, subject to any resolution passed by the club in general meeting, such other sources as the board determines.

After discussion and considering several objections from members that have been raised with me, the Board has decided **not** to impose any cost to members for attending meetings via Zoom.

School Scholarships:

To further support the Club's involvement with the Rotary Junior Community Awards the Board has agreed that the Club will offer 5 x \$100 scholarships to **each** of Frankston Heights Primary School and Belvedere Primary School to support families experiencing financial hardship with the costs of excursions, camps and other expenses associated with school.

Rotary Clock:

The Rotary Clock at the Arts Centre has stopped working. Suzanne to contact Arts Centre and Ginevra Hosking.

Kankarma Christmas Party:

The Board agreed to make a donation of \$500 to Kankarma in lieu of a Christmas Party this year. Due to Covid restrictions the last two years the club has not run its annual Christmas Party. We will request that Kankarma provide details as to how the money will be spent and follow up the spending of the money in 2021.

Art Show:

The Board agreed that Gallery 247 will be employed to provide support for the Art Show. This support includes access to an extensive list of artists, website for our show, and a range of other supports. Neil, Max and Suzanne have meet with Gallery 247 on two occasions in order to ascertain the support provided. The majority of Art Shows use this platform to promote and manage their show.

Club Donation Board:

The list is still being finalised. The list will be displayed at the Farmers Market.

Zone 8 Regionalisation Vote:

On behalf of the Club, I voted Yes on the Zone 8 Regionalisation pilot project. I received this receipt.


