



LAST WEEK

CLUB ASSEMBLY REPORT

Thanks to all members who attended my second Club Assembly last week, both in person and via Zoom. Here's a brief summary of the discussions.

1. Child Safe Standards – President Suzanne spoke on the recent District presentation she attended, where we are required to have all Club members must hold current Working With Children Cards (WWC) and Rotary Form 3 in order to be compliant. We need to do this to ensure that we can continue with the many Youth projects we currently support. It's an easy process with no cost involved - https://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/individuals/applicants/how-to-apply-1. Geoff Pritchard will request a brief presentation by our District Youth Protection Officer in the early New Year to clarify matters. Someone pointed out that during the length of discussion we had we could have each applied

for a WWC online three times. It's not hard and it's not about us, it's about

looking after our young people.

- 2. Golf Day 2023 proceeds the Golf Day committee had recommended to the Board that the proceeds from 2023 go again to Community Support Frankston (CSF). As this is a major decision, I felt it was appropriate to discuss this with all Club members, as almost every member (and many partners) worked hard to ensure the recent Golf Day was the outstanding success it was. With \$20,000 donated to CSF this year, I asked the question as to whether next year's proceeds should go solely to CSF, or whether we should spread these funds around to equally deserving charitable organisations. It was suggested that possibly CSF could be the major beneficiary, with some other organisations sharing smaller amounts. The final decision of where we will donate our Golf Day proceeds for 2023 will be made by the Board shortly, to ensure that promotion can be started soon.
- 3. Farmer's Market Volunteers following a recent WhatsApp post by Luke Provis calling for volunteers to assist with market BBQ activities, I've now sought clarification from Luke, as suggested at the Club Assembly. Luke would like to see more members and partners registering their availability to assist with the market BBQ, as currently this list isn't very long, meaning the same people are called upon regularly to work. With more people on the list, the fewer times people will be called upon to help out. If you aren't currently volunteering at the Farmer's Market or the market BBQ, please consider doing your bit by speaking to Luke (BBQ) or Max Lane (Market rota).
- 4. **Rotary Club of Frankston Art Show 2023** Neil Black provided an outline of progress thus far, with Lee Anne Smith asking each member to suggest a potential sponsor. The art display stands are still being assembled, with Neil pointing out that the Rotary Club of Berwick have brought in about \$19,000 in

the past year by renting out their art display stands – something that we could consider doing in our area. The Art Show website is now operational, at https://frankstonrotaryartshow.com.au/.

All potential sponsors are to be clarified with Lee Anne, to ensure that we aren't approaching an organisation that may be a sponsor for the Rotary Golf Day, or a competitor business to a sponsor we've already secured. Can all members please give some consideration to potential sponsors and speak to Lee Anne, providing her with the company details and the contact person.

- 5. **Bar Rostering at MEBC** we need more members and partners to volunteer to gain their Responsible Serving of Alcohol (RSA). David has investigated several organisations that provide online training to the required standard SITHFAB002, and will liaise with Grahame Henderson to clarify specific requirements of MEBC. It is envisaged that new RSA certified members will most likely undertake bar duty three weeks running, with the first week under supervision. Once they are experienced, these people will be rostered on for two-week periods, with potentially enough members and partners showing interest to help out at the bar, we're hoping that they will only be called upon no more than three times a year.
- 6. Guest Speaker Presentations David raised the matter that many of our presenters provide their presentations in Microsoft PowerPoint but these are often converted to Microsoft Photos, which looks unprofessional. Comments from Barry Thomas and Robin Stewart (who handle the Zoom side of our presentation) indicated that there are varying versions of PowerPoint which are not always compatible with our technology. Barry and Robin are currently preparing a report that they will provide to the Board in January.
- 7. **Partners' Night** following discussion about the inclusiveness of the term "Partners' Night", it was decided by those present that we should from now on refer to our meetings held on the first Thursday of each month as "Family and Friends' Night".

A productive evening with some robust discussions – my apologies if I ruffled any feathers but I took the view that as the President for 2023-24, I'm keen that we need to canvass a broad range of ideas and topics from all members, and not necessarily leave all decision making to the Rotary Board. The Board needs guidance from our membership, as it is all members that the Board represents.
